- Wayne N. Burton, M.D. has over 40 years of experience in healthcare and corporate occupational medicine services including healthcare data integration, wellness and disease management programs, and integrated disability management.
- He was Chief Medical Officer for American Express from 2009-2017. Prior to that he was Corporate Medical Director for JPMorgan Chase for more than 25 years. In 1992, co-founded and became President of Northwestern Internists, a primary care practice based at Northwestern Memorial Hospital in Chicago. He has collaborated with Benefits departments since 1982 to strategically design health and wellness benefit programs and cost management strategies.
- He is a Fellow of the American College of Physicians, the Institute of Medicine of Chicago, and the American College of Occupational and Environmental Medicine (ACOEM). He is also past Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Midwest Business Group on Health and past member of the Board of Directors of the National Business Group on Health.
- He has been the recipient of several awards including the Jonas Salk Award for Health Management from the March of Dimes, the Innovation Award from the National Mental Health Association (Mental Health America) in 2007, the 2008 Excellence in Prevention of Disease Award from the Portes Foundation/ Institute of Medicine of Chicago, the 2009 NBCH/ACOEM Global Health Leadership Award, the President's Award from ACOEM and HERO's 2015 Mark Dundon Research Award.
- He is on the editorial boards of Population Health Management and the Journal of Health and Productivity and has authored or co-authored more than 100 articles, including several with Dr. Allen.

William Rogers, PhD

Statistician



- Dr. Rogers has been a senior statistician at The Health Institute at Tufts Medical Center and a co-developer of leading surveys of work functioning (Work Limitations Questionnaire), and depression (the PC-Sad depression screener.) He has also had a lead role in the design and analysis of numerous studies of medical care and productivity with Tufts, the Harris Allen Group, and the Pacific Business Group on Health.
- Prior to joining The Health Institute, Dr. Rogers worked at the Rand Corporation, where he led design and analysis efforts on major health services research projects including the RAND Health Insurance Experiment (1975-85), the Medical Outcomes Study (1984-93), and the RAND DRG Medicare Prospective Payment Study (1986-90). He was also a developer of the STATA statistical package .
- After joining The Health Institute in 1993, Dr. Rogers was a senior collaborator on the Primary Care Assessment Survey, a precursor to the CG-CAHPS survey, and a principal investigator on the Harvard CAHPS-II team. He also co-founded and directs survey statistics and product development at Quality Data Management (www.qdmnet.com), a leader in delivering quality and process improvement systems to the healthcare industry
- Dr. Rogers has worked with Dr. Allen on many projects over the years, including the Employee Health Care Value Survey for the Xerox, GTE and Digital Equipment Corporations, several Navistar projects, and several BCBS plan projects and several projects at Tufts. Most recently, he is one of the co-authors sharing the ACOEM 2015 Kammer Award. He has (co-)authored over 250 publications.

- Dr. Erdil is a physician with Occupational & Environmental Health Network in Marlborough MA. He is also an Assistant Professor at the University of Connecticut Health Center in the Department of Internal Medicine; a Community Staff Physician at Hartford Hospital; and an Adjunct Medical Staff Physician in Orthopedics at New England Baptist Hospital.
- Dr. Erdil is Board Certified in Occupational & Environmental Medicine, and a Fellow of the American College of Occupational & Environmental Medicine. He served as a reviewer for the Agency for Health Care Policy & Research Acute Low Back Problems in Adults 1994; and the American College of Occupational & Environmental Medicine Occupational Medicine Practice Guidelines 1st edition 1997.
- Dr. Erdil serves on the Editorial Advisory Board for the Official Disability Guidelines Treatment in Workers Comp. Dr. Erdil has co-authored several publications, including Cumulative Trauma Disorders of the Upper Extremity, and Biomechanics of Manual Material Handling and Low Back Pain for Zenz' Occupational Medicine Mosby 1994; Cumulative Trauma Disorders: Prevention, Evaluation, and Treatment Van Nostrand Reinhold 1997; the Health Effects Section in the Proposed OSHA Ergonomics Rule 1999; co-authored Medications, Driving and Work for the AMA Physician's Guide to Return to Work in 2005; and is the topic author for UpToDate Occupational Low Back Pain.
- Dr. Erdil has presented at several Grand Rounds and other conferences including AOHC and NECOEM, WOEMA, SEAK, Federal Occupational Health Conference, Massachusetts Medical Society and Connecticut Public Health Dept. Symposia on The Opioid Epidemic and others. He received the Harriet Hardy Award from the New England College of Occupational & Environmental Medicine in Dec 2016.
